Basically, I want to revert commits I made to the file, and then push. The only thing I want to keep are the commits I have made in the repo, but I cannot seem to remove those commits. I have tried "git reset HEAD" but that says the commit is already "detached", and refuses to allow me to revert it. I have tried to use "git revert HEAD", but that seems to just set it back to the same state as before I committed the changes... And then I can't do anything... How can I get git to change something in a file, while keeping the commits I made, and not the commit where the current status is on?
